

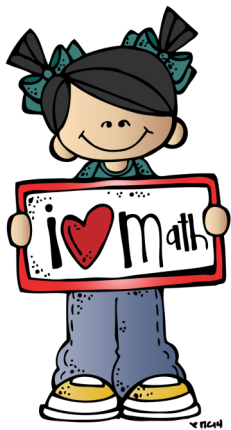

# Easter Triduum

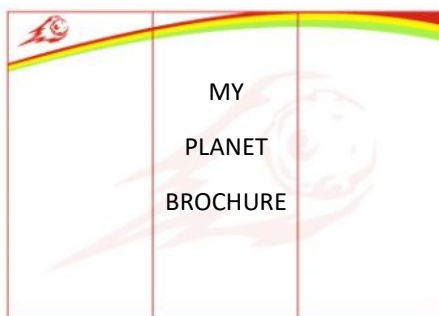


In religion, we finish up our textbook with chapters about Easter, the Easter Triduum, and One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church. We discuss that the Easter season is a special time to rejoice over the new life we have in Christ. We learn that the Easter Triduum is the Church's greatest celebration of the Paschal Mystery.



In math, we finish up chapter 9, multiplying and dividing decimals, with our chapter test scheduled the week of April 10th. We will begin chapter 10 when we come back from Easter break. Geometry is our focus! Bring those protractors!!

In social studies, we will read weeks 24 to 26 in our Studies Weekly newspapers. We learn about the aftermath of the Revolutionary War and the impact it had on families. We read about revolutionary women and African Americans in the war. Finally, we read about state constitutions and how they helped inspire the U.S. Constitution.



In science, we will begin a "planet brochure" project. Students work to design a brochure on a planet that encourages people to come visit for a vacation. This will be a group project in class. Students will present their brochure the week of April 10<sup>th</sup>. After Easter break, we begin chapter 3 on basic structures of organisms.

In language arts, we will begin our third and final novel, Holes, after Easter break. In grammar, we learn about verb tenses, irregular verbs, prefixes, and similes and metaphors.
