Dear Parents,



It was a unique experience in "sharing" and "cooperation", culminating in a grand feast enjoyed by all. Of course, our celebration would not have been possible without strong parental support, assistance, and perseverance.

Our main focus this coming month will be on the true meaning of Christmas and the current season of Advent.

Advent is a season of waiting and preparing our hearts for the coming of Christ. The children have been told that we all must prepare our hearts, as well as we prepare our Christmas trees for this joyous event. One way to do this is by sharing with others, who are less fortunate. We will be collecting toys for children who are hospitalized and those who are less fortunate, which is a small part of our "School Wide Faith in Action" focus this year. We hope this will promote the concept of sharing and giving without expecting something in return.



In reading, we will be working on our sight vocabulary lists and strengthening our phonetic skills with practice in grade level readers that compliment the reading program.
