I can't believe how quickly 2019 is going! The students will present their famous person report on March 19th. We will be having stations of the cross every Thursday in March starting



The majority of Lent lands in March this year. We will spend this month talking about the sorrowful mysteries and the stations of the cross. We will learn about Jesus' passion and death. We will begin to understand why it is so important and the difference it made for us.



For reading, we will begin our unit, "Talent Show". In this unit, we will see three different children and how they use their talents. The students will see that a talent can be something big or small but can be used in a great way no matter what. We will look deeply into what talents we have and how God has blessed us all in a special way.

We will learn how to subtract three digit numbers for math. We will also learn how to subtract money by first lining up the decimal point. We will learn how to regroup twice with subtraction.

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We will be studying laws in social studies. We will learn about federal laws and state laws. We will see how a law is made and how they can be changed.

For science, we will begin learning about rocks and minerals. We will learn about weathering and how that can affect our environment. We will learn what a natural resource is and how to conserve them.



In handwriting, we will continue cursive. The students are so excited to learn this new way to write. We have finished all the lower case letters and will begin the capital letters. Cursive will take quite a while to perfect so we will work on it for the remainder of the year. The students will soon be able to write papers in class using cursive.

We will continue to alternate between spelling and vocabulary words. This will help improve the students writing as well as their speech.
